**Reserve early!** Reserve campsites two days to nine months in advance by calling Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687) or visiting [www.oregonstateparks.org](http://www.oregonstateparks.org).

Detroit Lake’s campground offers nearly 300 sites on the shore of a forest-ringed canyon reservoir in the Cascade Mountains. The nine-mile-long lake is a popular destination for fishing, boating, and other water sports. Sightseers enjoy views of snow-capped Mt. Jefferson in the distance.

### Camping

March 15 - October 31: All loops open for reservations.  
November 1 - March 14: Only F loop open (available first-come, first-served).

- 107 full-hookup sites (sewer, electricity, water)
- Paved parking, picnic tables, and fire ring at all sites
- 69 electrical sites with water
- Showers and flush toilets
- 98 tent sites with water nearby
- Swimming areas
- Firewood for sale

### Universal Access

Three campsites (F24, F25, and G30) are accessible to campers with disabilities.

### Camping Rates

### Discovery Season

From October 1 - April 30, you can rent a full, electric, or tent site for less. At most state parks, including Detroit Lake, you can get \$4 off summer rates.

### Limited Parking

Campsites are limited to eight people per site, and **only one extra vehicle is allowed per campsite** due to environmental restrictions. All vehicles must be parked on pavement, either at the site or in a designated parking area. Once a site has two registered vehicles, no other vehicles may park there. We strongly recommend that visitors rent enough sites to accommodate all of their vehicles. Park staff strictly enforce these regulations.

### Other Park Features

The campground has horseshoe pits, a basketball court, and a volleyball area; you can check out equipment from the registration booth. There is also a playground in the A loop.

Interpretive programs are offered mid-May through mid-September; schedules are posted at the visitor center and registration booth. Junior Ranger activities are offered daily in July and August.

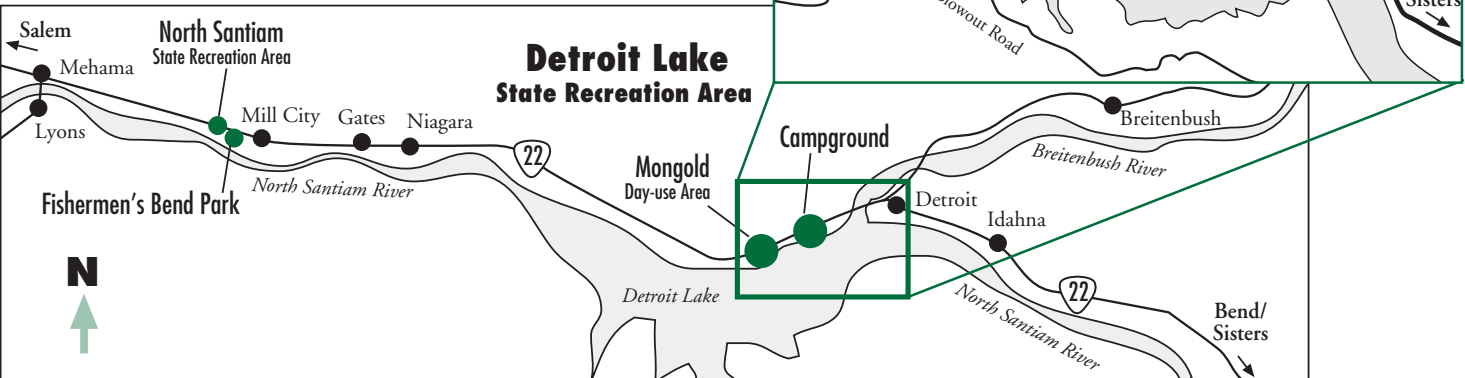
### Boating and Fishing

The park’s fishing dock is accessible from the F loop area. Anglers can search out rainbow trout, catfish, kokanee (landlocked blueback salmon), and landlocked Chinook. Courtesy boat ramps are located in the D and G loops, with 15-minute time limits for loading and unloading passengers and gear. Boat trailer parking is available at the G loop ramp. Overnight boat moorages are available in the F and H loops and may be rented by registered campers.

### Mongold Day-Use Area

Mongold Day-use Area is located 1.2 miles west of the campground on Oregon Highway 22. It offers year-round boating access, weather permitting. Facilities include:

- Large paved boat ramp with seasonal courtesy dock
- Low-water winter ramp
- Enclosed swim area with a grass “beach”
- Restrooms with changing areas
- Picnic area
- 72 single-car and 120 RV/trailer parking spaces

Overnight parking at Mongold is permitted if you are camping on Piety Island or on a shoreline accessible only by boat. A valid day-use parking permit is required for all days the vehicle is in the park.

### Day-Use Area

Day-use parking permits are required year-round in both the Mongold Day-use Area and the Detroit Lake campground. You will need to display either a daily permit, a 12- or 24-month permit, or a camping receipt. Your camping receipt serves as a daily permit for all of the days you are registered. You can purchase a daily permit at the entrance booth or from a nearby vending machine. The 12-month and 24-month day-use permits are sold at the overnight campground booth and at major state park offices.

### Information and Supplies

The Detroit Lake Visitor Center has more information on activities and services in the area as well as first aid and a lost and found. There is also a store where you can buy gifts, bagged ice, and soft drinks.
