Goose Lake State Recreation Area is a peaceful lakeside destination for both people and wildlife. Its expanse of green grass and shade trees makes it an inviting place to camp, and the lake is a pleasant spot for boating.

- Paved parking, picnic table, and fire ring at all sites
- Flush toilets and hot showers
- RV dump station
- Primitive boat ramp

## About the Park

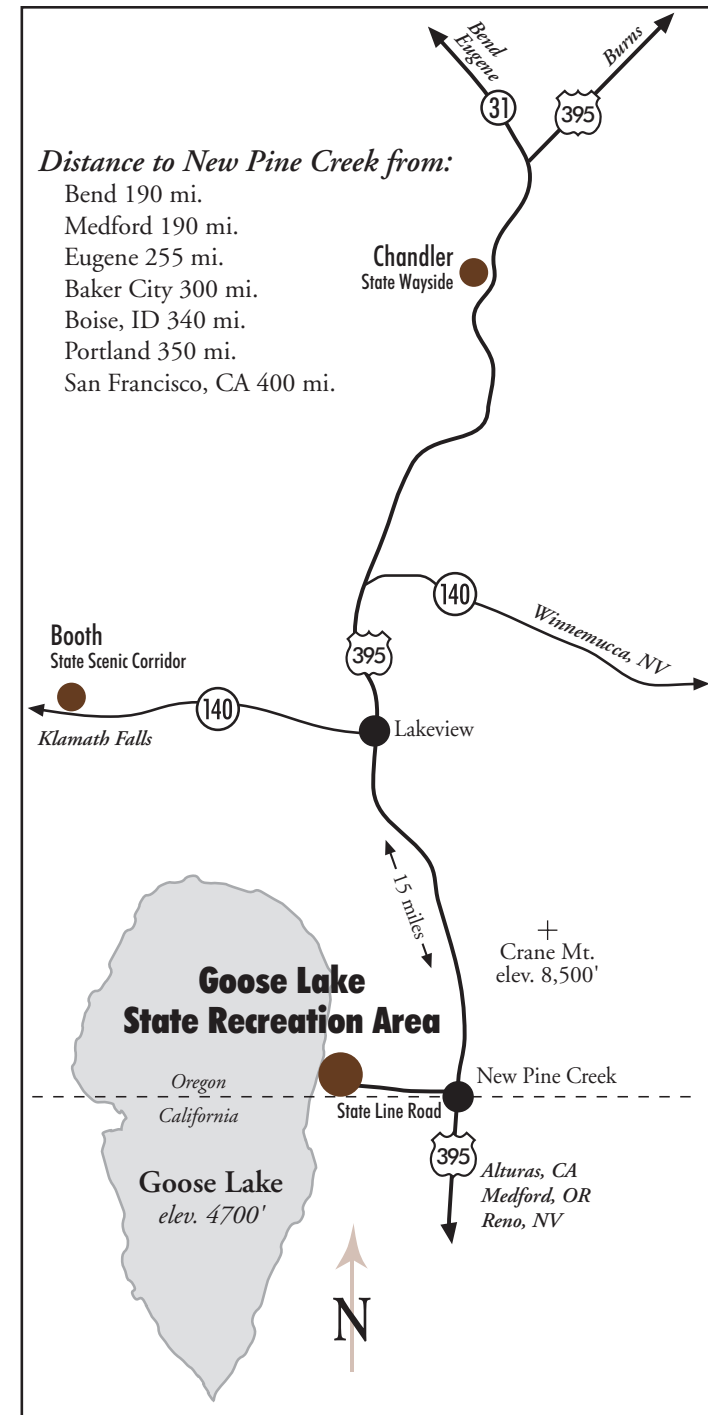
The campground sits on the shore of Goose Lake, a large, shallow lake that straddles the Oregon-California border. Its remote location makes camping reservations unnecessary. The Lake County railroad, which crosses the park, runs mid-day to the main line in Alturas, California.

Migratory waterfowl are most abundant in the spring and early summer when stream runoff is at its peak. Mule deer frequent the park during the morning and evening in late summer and fall to feed on fruit from an old homesteader's orchard located within the campground.

The park provides a base from which to explore areas such as Hart Mountain Wildlife Refuge, the 8,500-foot Warner Mountains just east of the park, and the obsidian beds in the Modoc National Forest of northeast California. Nearby Lakeview (15 miles north) offers fuel, groceries, vehicle repair services, and restaurants.

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- All vehicles must be parked on pavement.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but must be ridden with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)
