Reserve early! Reserve campsites and yurts two days to nine months in advance by calling Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687) or visiting www.oregonstateparks.org.

Located on Oregon's rugged south coast, Harris Beach State Recreation Area offers a splendid seascape for sightseers and an inviting sandy beach with tidepools for beachcombers.

Year-Round Camping

- 34 full-hookup sites (sewer, electricity, water)
- 50 electrical sites with water
- 63 tent sites with water nearby
- Six yurts (one pet-friendly)
- Paved parking, picnic table, and fire rings at all sites
- Hiker/biker camp
- Playground
- Flush toilets and hot showers
- Cable TV at selected sites
- Firewood for sale (see park hosts)
- Laundromat
- RV dump station (please use the station to empty full holding tanks rather than campsite connections, which can overflow)

Universal Access

1 campsite (B38) and 1 yurt (BX28) are accessible to campers with disabilities.

Discovery Season

From October 1–April 30, you can rent a full, electric, or tent site for less. At most state parks, including Harris Beach, you can get \$4 off summer rates.

Yurts!

Enjoy the year-round comforts of a domed tent with structural support, a wood floor, lockable wooden door, lights and heating, and beds with vinyl covered mattresses. A bunk bed sleeps three, and a futon couch sleeps two. A fire ring, picnic table, and paved parking are right outside. There is one pet-friendly yurt, BX28; up to two pets (cats and/or dogs only) are allowed.

Activities at the Park

Harris Beach offers several trails to viewpoints and the beach with opportunities to see a large assortment of plants and wildlife. Junior Ranger programs open to children age 6-12 and evening campfire programs for everyone are offered throughout the summer. Check with the registration booth for current schedules and information.

Beach Treasures

The southern Oregon coast is a beachcomber's paradise. Miles of sandy beaches offer opportunities to find a variety of seashells and stones.

The Harris Beach day-use area is ideally positioned for beach access and beachside picnicking with a view. The seascape includes the largest island off the Oregon coast, a formation alternately called Bird or Goat Island. The island is a National Wildlife Sanctuary, preserving a breeding site for rare birds such as the tufted puffin.

More to See

Samuel H. Boardman State Scenic Corridor: This 12-mile-long park along Highway 101 is a series of scenic waysides, some with picnic tables where you can sit and enjoy unparalleled ocean views. Or you can explore the park by foot via the Oregon Coast Trail. The south end of the park is only three miles north of Harris Beach.

Boats in Brookings: A boat launching ramp, moorage facilities, boat rentals, and charter boat service are available at the south jetty, near the mouth of the Chetco River.

Jet boat rides: Gold Beach, 30 miles north of Brookings, offers jet boat rides up the famous Rogue River.

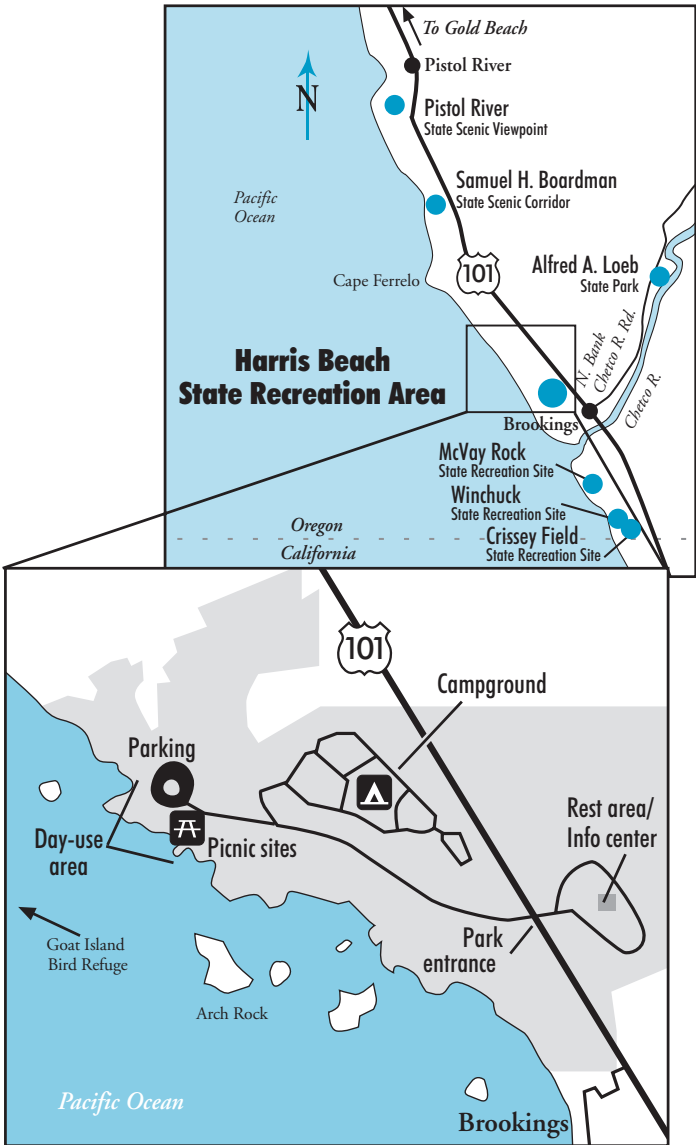

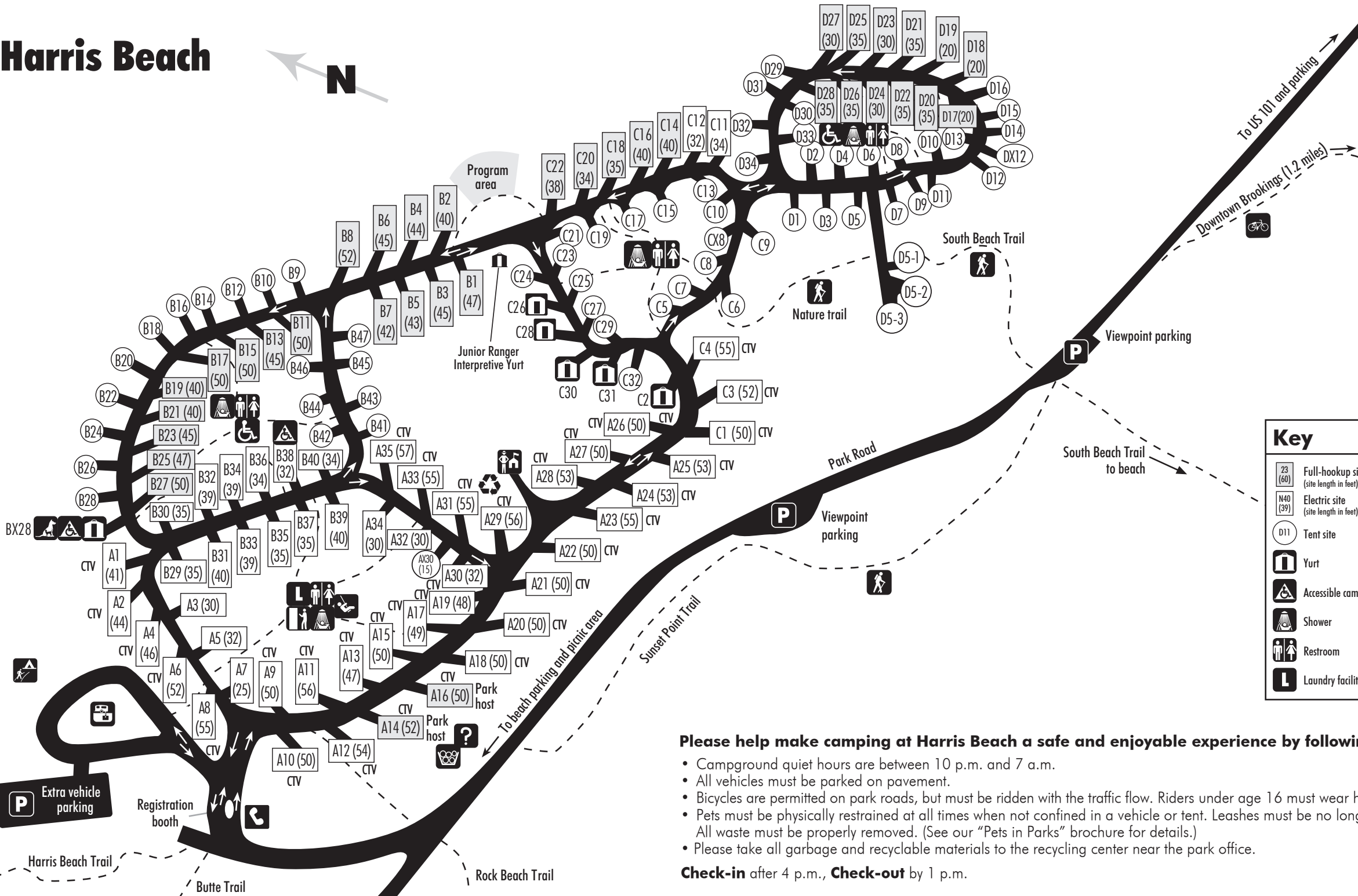

Please help make camping at Harris Beach a safe and enjoyable experience by following these and other park rules:

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- All vehicles must be parked on pavement.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but must be ridden with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)
- Please take all garbage and recyclable materials to the recycling center near the park office.

Check-in after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m.
