

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m M}$ ilo McIver State Park offers seasonal camping and yearround recreation ranging from horseback riding and disc golf to boating and fishing along the scenic Clackamas River.

Seasonal Camping

(Mid-March–October)

- 44 electrical sites with water
- Nine tent sites with water nearby
- Paved parking, picnic table, and fire ring at all sites
- Hot showers and flush toilets
- Three group tent camping areas with water, flush toilets, and fire rings
- Hiker/biker camp
- RV dump station located just past the registration booth (please do not dump sewer waste into waste water basins)

Universal Access

One campsite (A10) is accessible to campers with disabilities.

Discovery Season

Between October 1 and April 30, camping in an Oregon state park costs less. At Milo McIver, you can get \$4 off per night on summer rates for electrical sites from mid-March through April 30 and again during the month of October.

Enjoy the View

Milo McIver features more than 950 acres of lush forest and grassy meadows on natural terraces above the Clackamas River as well as vistas of three prominent Cascade peaks: Oregon's Mt. Hood and Washington's Mount St. Helens and Mt. Adams. A memorial viewpoint near the entrance honors Milo K. McIver, an Oregon State Highway Commissioner from 1950 to 1962.

Year-Round Day-Use Fun


Milo McIver State Park has two inviting day-use areas open year-round. The **Riverbend** day-use area has rolling grass meadows accented by maple and Douglas-fir trees. Here you will find trails, picnic shelters, restrooms, a 27-hole disc golf course, and a primitive boat launch. Picnic tables are located near each of the major parking areas. Several group picnic areas include shelters that accommodate large groups. The shelters are reservable through Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687).

The **Riverside** day-use area has picnic tables, a group picnic area, a boating/rafting access ramp, a large parking area, and a fish hatchery operated by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife. The hatchery raises and releases more than a million Chinook salmon each year. The group picnic area near the hatchery can accommodate up to 200 people. Seven miles of hiking and horseback trails meander through meadows and forested hillsides.

Day-use visitors must have a valid parking permit. You can buy a daily permit at the park's entrance booth or purchase 12- and 24-month permits at major state park offices, including the Milo McIver office. Your camping receipt serves as a daily parking permit for the days you are registered.

Play it Safe


The park has many access points to the Clackamas River. Do not try to navigate the river unless you have the proper equipment and skill. The river current can be swift. Always wear a life jacket.
