

Boulder Lakeshore Trail #463B



Recreation Opportunity Guide

Distance..... 0.6 miles (loop)
Elevation..... 4550-4600 feet
Snow Free June to October



Trail Highlights: This is an easy trail around a beautiful alpine lake. There are ten tent-only campsites at Boulder Lake.

Trail Description: The best way to reach this trail is from Forest Road 4880. From the trailhead, head west on Boulder Lake Trail #463 and travel 0.4 mile to the junction with this trail. This trail can also be reached from Bonney Meadows Campground by following Boulder Lake Trail #463 1.7 miles south to the beginning of this trail.

Regulations & Leave No Trace Information:

Leave No Trace

- Plan Ahead and Prepare: Prepare for extreme weather, hazards and emergencies.
 - Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces: Use established trails and campsites.
 - Dispose of Waste Properly: Pack out all trash, leftover food and litter.
 - Leave What You Find: Avoid introducing or transporting non-native species.
 - Minimize Campfire Impacts: Use established fire rings & keep fires small.
 - Respect Wildlife: Control pets at all times.
- Be Considerate of Other Visitors: Avoid loud voices and noises.

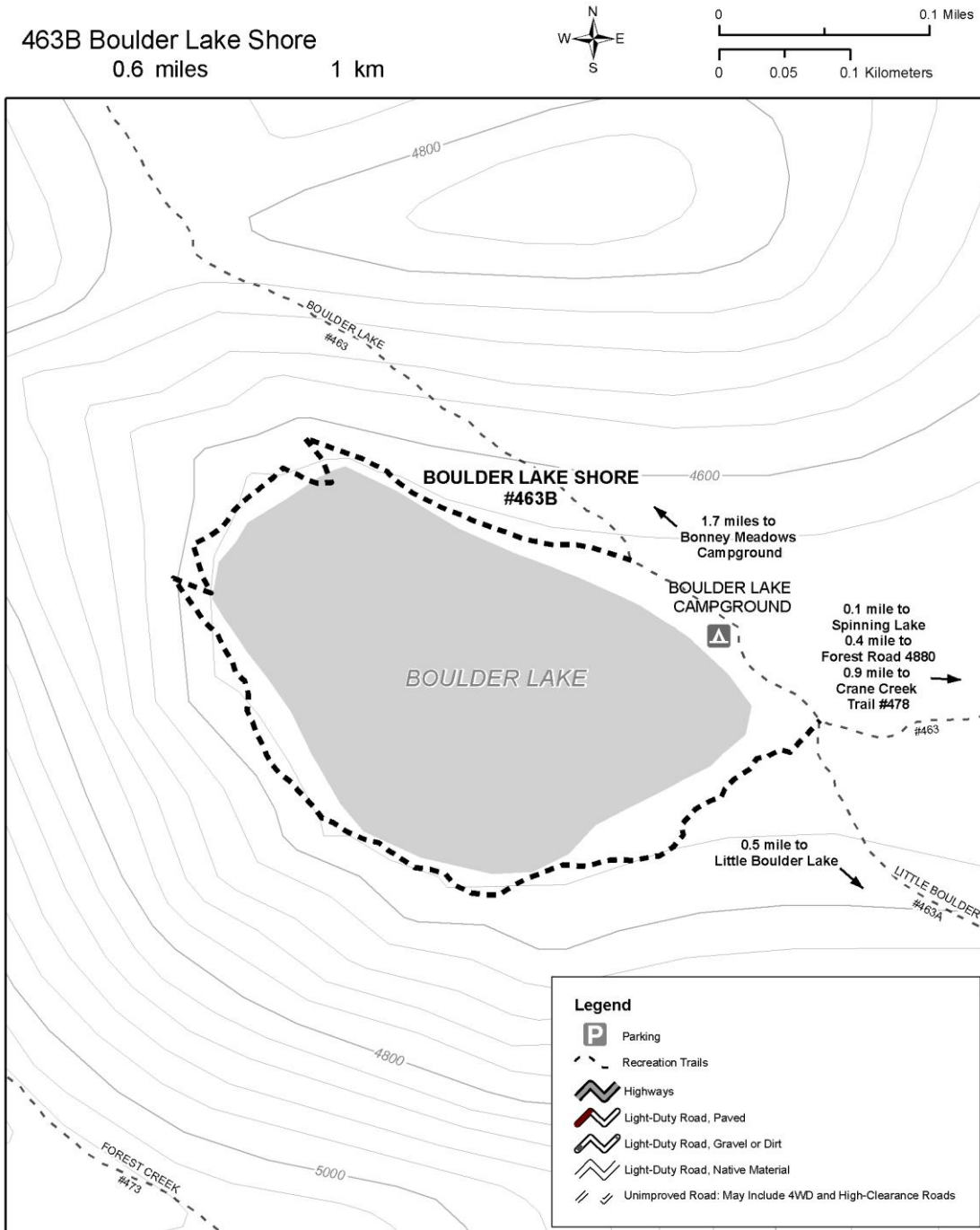

Directions to Trailhead: From Hood River, take HWY 35 south 34.1 to forest road 48 miles then go 16 miles to the 4880 RD. Continue 6.5 miles and park in the pullout on the east side of the road. Boulder Lake Trail #463 starts on the west side of the road. Follow it 0.4 mile to the junction with this trail (#463B).

From Tygh Valley, head west on Forest Road 48 and travel 20.5 miles to Forest Road 4880. Turn right (northwest) on Forest Road 4880. Continue 6.5 miles and park in the pullout on the east side of the road. Boulder Lake Trail #463 starts on the west side of the road. Follow it 0.4 mile to the junction with this trail (#463B).
