# **School Canyon Trail #468**



## **Recreation Opportunity Guide**





**Trail Highlights:** This little used trail is in the southeastern portion of the Badger Creek Wilderness. This is a nice trail for solitude.

**Trail Description:** This trail begins at Forest Road 27 and ends at its junction with Little Badger Trail #469. Beginning at Forest Road 27 (2,640'), the trail heads uphill and after 1.5 miles the trail passes Ball Point to the south. After passing Ball Point the trail continues to traverse and climb to the junction with Little Badger Trail #469 (3,960'). There is a nice campsite just west of the junction.

## **Regulations & Leave No Trace Information:**

Group size is limited to 12. Stock are counted in the group size. For example, 3 people riding their own horse plus a spare horse in the group for packing would make a group of 7.

#### **Leave No Trace**

- > Plan Ahead and Prepare: Prepare for extreme weather, hazards and emergencies.
- > Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces: Use established trails and campsites.
- Dispose of Waste Properly: Pack out all trash, leftover food and litter.
- Leave What You Find: Avoid introducing or transporting non-native species.
- Minimize Campfire Impacts: Use established fire rings & keep fires small.
- Respect Wildlife: Control pets at all times.
- > Be Considerate of Other Visitors: Avoid loud voices and noises.

**Directions to Trailhead:** From Dufur, travel south on US Hwy 197 for 13.8 miles to Shadybrook Road. Turn right onto Shadybrook and travel 1.1 miles to Fairgrounds Road. Travel 0.6 mile on Fairgrounds Road and ? right onto Badger Creek Road. Travel 6.5 miles and turn right onto Forest Road 27. Travel 1.5 miles on Forest Road 27 to the small parking area on the left (west) side of the road.
