Trail Highlights: This trail is in the Mark O. Hatfield Wilderness Area. There area several scenic meadows and campsites on Benson Plateau.

Trail Description: This short trail connects Ruckel Creek Trail #405 and Benson Way Trail #405B on the Benson Plateau. To reach this trail, follow Ruckel Creek Trail #405 5.1 miles east from the junction with Gorge Trail #400.

Regulations & Leave No Trace Information:

➤ Group size is limited to 12. Stock are counted in the group size. For example, 3 people riding their own horse plus a spare horse in the group for packing would make a group of 7.

Leave No Trace

- > Plan Ahead and Prepare: Prepare for extreme weather, hazards and emergencies.
- Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces: Use established trails and campsites.
- Dispose of Waste Properly: Pack out all trash, leftover food and litter.
- Leave What You Find: Avoid introducing or transporting non-native species.
- Minimize Campfire Impacts: Use established fire rings & keep fires small.
- Respect Wildlife: Control pets at all times.
- Be Considerate of Other Visitors: Avoid loud voices and noises.

Directions to Trailhead: Eastbound I-84 – Take Eagle Creek exit # 41. Turn right, park at the picnic ground entrance, and hike 0.1 mile (0.2 km) up the road toward Eagle Creek Overlook. Take Gorge Trail # 400 0.5 mile (0.8 km) to the junction of Trail # 405, which starts alongside an abandoned Historic Columbia River Highway bridge on the east side of Ruckel Creek. See Trailhead Description on page 1 for directions to this trail. Westbound I-84 – Take Bonneville Dam exit # 40. Drive under the freeway and join eastbound traffic. After 1 mile (1.6 km) take Eagle Creek exit # 41 and follow directions to trail from above. **Please park your car near the day use hosts if you are hiking overnight.**
