

Dry Fir Trail #674A



Recreation Opportunity Guide

Distance..... 3.1 miles (one way)
Elevation..... 3600-4400 feet
Snow Free June to November



Trail Highlights: A lightly used forest trail with nice views near the top, and a couple of small creeks.

Trail Description: From the trailhead on the north end, the trail descends the ridge through the forest. Near the top, the trail crosses an old clear cut which provides views of Cascade Range, before plunging through the forest. The descent is moderate with many switchbacks. The trail terminates on the south end in an open logged out area.

Regulations & Leave No Trace Information:

Leave No Trace

- Plan Ahead and Prepare: Prepare for extreme weather, hazards and emergencies.
- Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces: Use established trails and campsites.
- Dispose of Waste Properly: Pack out all trash, leftover food and litter.
- Leave What You Find: Avoid introducing or transporting non-native species.
- Minimize Campfire Impacts: Use established fire rings & keep fires small.
- Respect Wildlife: Control pets at all times.
- Be Considerate of Other Visitors: Avoid loud voices and noises.

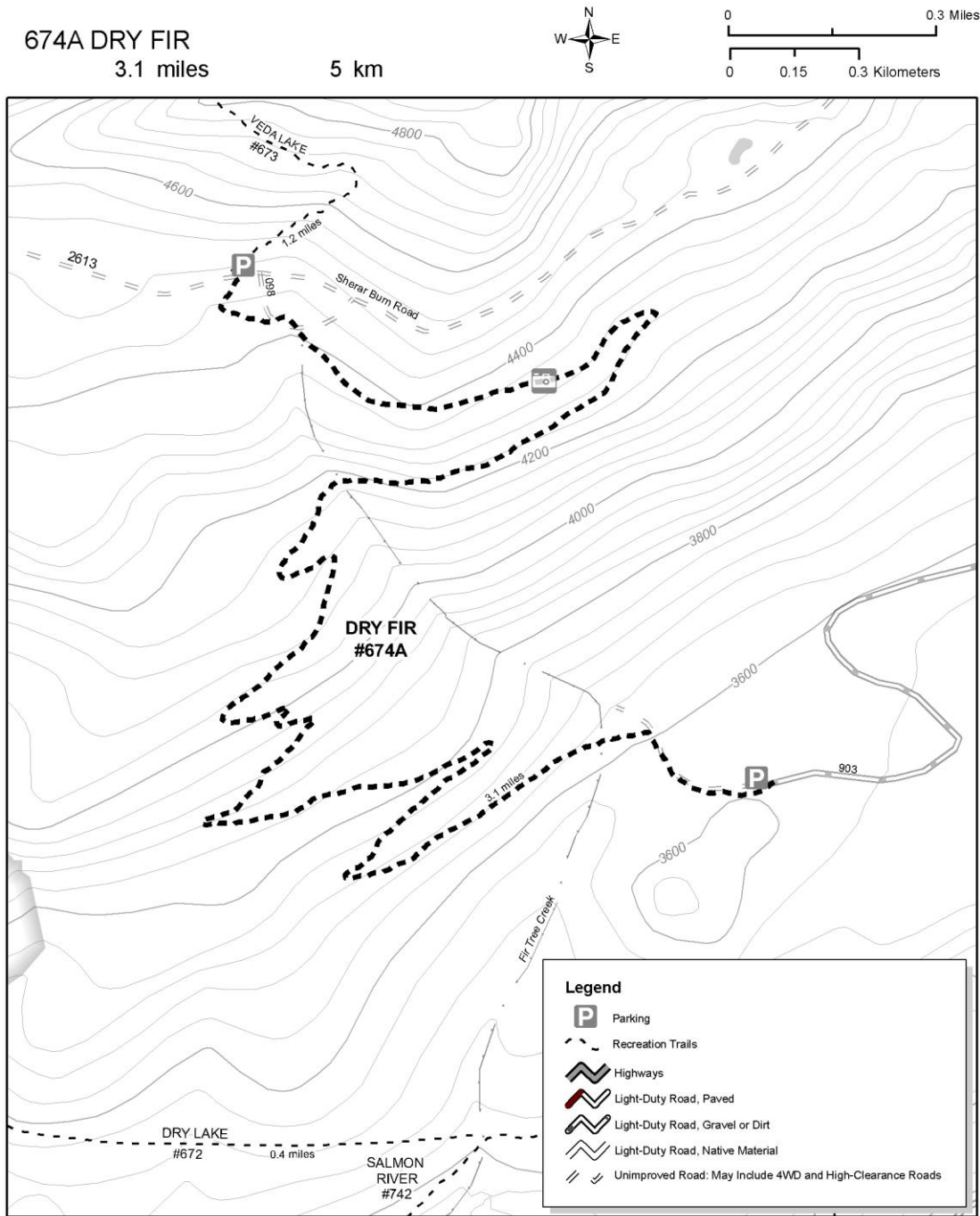

Directions to Trailhead: To reach the northern end from Portland, follow US Hwy 26 for 29.5 miles east of Sandy. Turn right (south) on Still Creek Campground Road (Forest Road 2650). Drive through the campground for 1.1 mile. Turn right at E Chimney Rock Road and continue 0.5 mile to a four way junction. Continue (right turn) onto Sherar Burn Road (Forest Road 2613) and travel 3.6 miles to the parking lot on the leftt (south) side of the road. The trailhead is located on the south side of the road. To reach the southern end from Portland, follow US Hwy 26 for 30.7 miles to Forest Road 2656 (Trillium Lake exit). Turn right and travel 1.8 miles. Turn left at Trillium Lake Road (NOT 2656 Loop, go further) and travel 1.1 miles. Take right fork to stay on Trillium Lake Road (Forest Road 2656-903) and travel 2.1 to the end of the road and the parking area (also the south trailhead for #673 Veda Lake).
