Recreation Opportunity Guide

Distance..... 2.5 miles (one way)
Elevation..... 3250 feet
Snow Free June to October



Trail Highlights: This trail travels along the south of Timothy Lake. There are great views of Timothy Lake the entire way and several spectacular views of Mount Hood.

Trail Description: This trail travels from it's junction with Pacific Crest Trail #200 along the south shore of Timothy Lake to it's junction with Timothy Lake Trail #528 at the southwest end of Timothy Lake. This trail passes through several campgrounds, boat ramps and beaches along the south shore of Timothy Lake.

Regulations & Leave No Trace Information:

Leave No Trace

- Plan Ahead and Prepare: Prepare for extreme weather, hazards and emergencies.
- Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces: Use established trails and campsites.
- Dispose of Waste Properly: Pack out all trash, leftover food and litter.
- Leave What You Find: Avoid introducing or transporting non-native species.
- Minimize Campfire Impacts: Use established fire rings & keep fires small.
- Respect Wildlife: Control pets at all times.
- Be Considerate of Other Visitors: Avoid loud voices and noises.

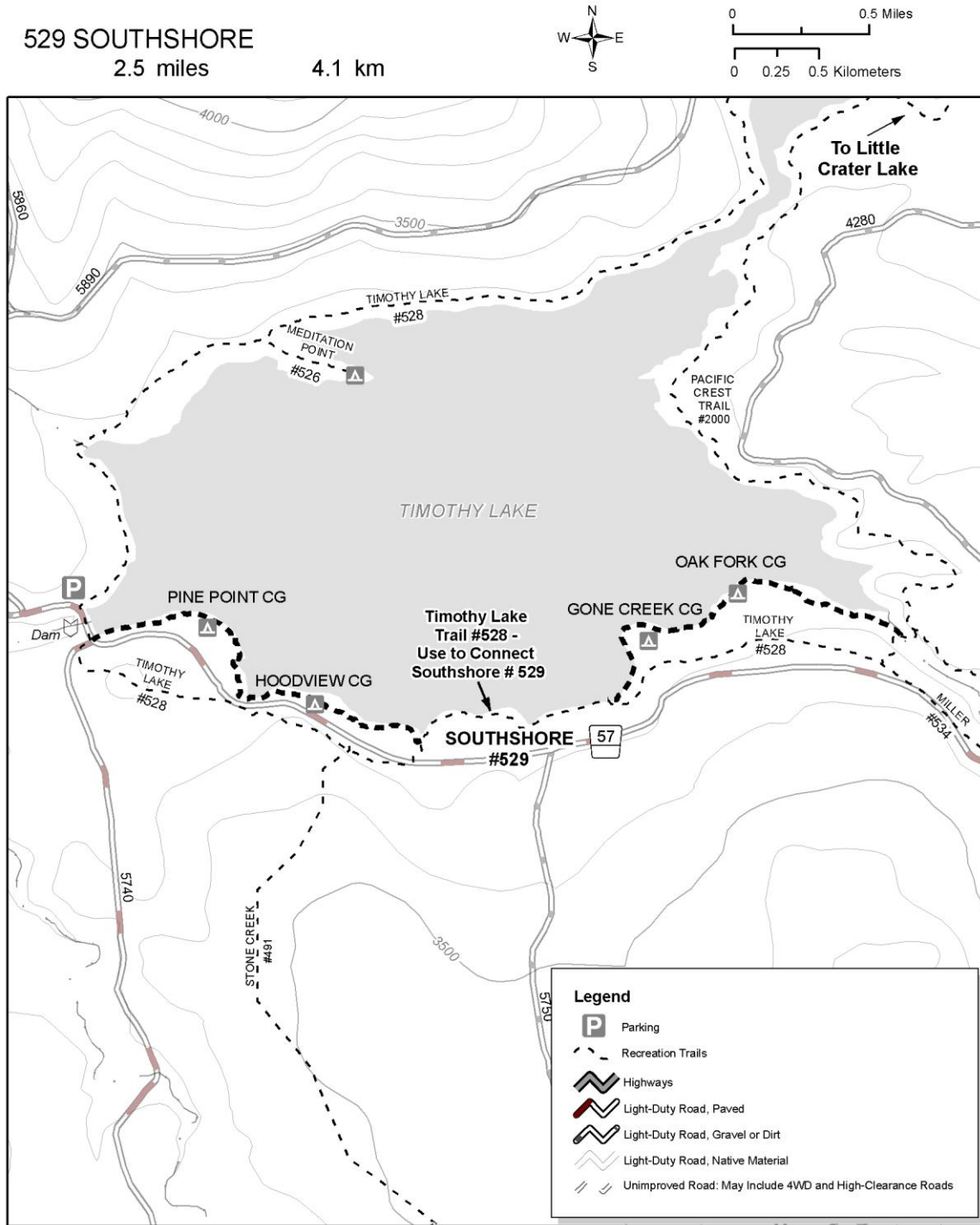

Directions to Trailhead: From Portland to the west end of the trail, take U.S. Hwy 26 40.2 miles southeast of Sandy to Skyline Road (Forest Road 42). Turn right at the sign (Forest Road 42), and continue 8.3 miles to the junction with Forest Road 57. Turn right and continue 3.6 miles to the dam. Turn right and drive 0.1 miles to a road intersection. Turn right on a gravel road and travel 0.1 miles to the Timothy Lake #528 trailhead parking area.
