m rineville}$  Reservoir State Park has two campgrounds and two day-use areas with boat ramps on the shore of a high desert canyon lake near the center of the state. It is an ideal destination for year-round fishing and wildlife viewing, and for summertime stargazing.

## **Main Campground**

(Full hookup sites open year-round)

- 22 full hookup sites (sewer, electricity, water)
- 22 electrical sites with water
- 23 tent sites with water nearby
- 5 deluxe log cabins (Cabin 5 is pet friendly)
- Paved parking, picnic table, fire ring at all sites
- Flush toilets and hot showers
- 32 boat moorages (summer only)
- Amphitheater for interpretive, evening programs

# **Jasper Point Camping and Day-Use**

(2.5 miles east of main campground; open May 1 – September 30; first-come, first-served)

- 30 electrical sites with water
- Flush toilets and hot showers
- Boat ramp
- RV dump station
- 1¾-mile lakeside hiking trail to main campground (easy to moderate hike)

### **Universal Access**

Campsites C10 and C11 and cabins 4 and 5 are accessible to campers with disabilities in the main campground. Sites 6 and 8 are accessible at Jasper Point.

## **Discovery Season**

From October 1-April 30, camping in an Oregon state park costs less. At Prineville Reservoir's main campground, you save \$4 per night off summer rates on full hookup, electrical and tent sites.

### **Enjoy Cabin Comforts**

Enjoy a view of the reservoir from three of the five deluxe cabins or camp with your pet in cabin number 5. Maximum 2 pets (cats and/or dogs only; donations accepted. All five of the cabins have bathrooms with showers, sleeping for six on beds with vinyl covered mattresses, heating and airconditioning, a microwave, refrigerator, and outdoor gas barbecue. The covered porch provides a place for year-round outdoor relaxation.

## **Water Sports Central**

Prineville Reservoir is a waterskiing, swimming, fishing and boating haven. Launch your boat from the day-use area or enjoy a buoy marked swimming area, open to day-use and overnight visitors, near the main campground.

The Prineville Reservoir Resort, three miles east of the park, has boat rentals, fuel, and supplies.

#### **Hunt for High Desert Treasures**

Rockhounds find many treasures in the Prineville area. Contact the Prineville Chamber of Commerce (541-447-6304) for information on rock collection in the area

Popular finds include agates with dendrites, white plume agates, various colored moss agates, green jasper, jasper interlaced with agate, Ochoco chalcedony, thunder eggs and petrified wood.

Want to see a really big rock? Explore Steins Pillar, a geological landmark on Mill Creek Road, 15 miles northeast of Prineville.
